- ➤ Include representatives of diverse groups of stakeholders in its activities, including national and local authorities, scientific organizations and universities, civil society and private sector as well as communities and bearers;
- > Promote gender equality and involve marginalized and vulnerable communities and individuals in its activities;
- Include young people in its activities;
- ➤ Collect and share up to date information on ICH related policies in SEE;
- ➤ Assess the results of the planned activities through regular monitoring and evaluation.

OUTPUT 1: NATIONAL CAPACITIES STRENGTHENED FOR IMPLEMENTING THE CONVENTION FOR THE SAFEGUARDING OF THE INTANGIBLE CULTURAL HERITAGE IN SOUTH-EASTERN EUROPE

1. WORKSHOP on the Implementation of the Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage with the staff of the Regional Centre in Sofia

Within the framework of the Global capacity-building strategy for the Implementation of the Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage, a 5-day workshop will be organized in Sofia, Bulgaria. The workshop aims at improving the understanding of the Convention among the staff of the Regional Centre as well as among key cooperation partners at the national level. The expected participants are: the staff of the Regional Centre, representatives of relevant authorities at the national level, experts, members of academia, NGOs and ICH bearers. Two experienced UNESCO-trained facilitators will deliver the training.

2. WORKSHOP on the Implementation of the Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage for national experts from Northeast Bulgaria

The workshop aims at reinforcing the capacities of key stakeholders from Northeast Bulgaria for the Implementation of the Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage. The workshop will provide training to about 20

1. OBSERVATORY FOR ICH RELATED POLICIES

The main objective of the Observatory is to provide comprehensive information on ICH related policies in the countries in South-Eastern Europe. Following the Convention's recommendation. Member States make efforts to improve their legislation and institutional infrastructure and to strengthen the capacities in the field of ICH. For this purpose, the Observatory will collect, monitor and analyse the progress of ICHrelated policies and activities in the region. Information collected will be presented in an on-line database, which will feature national strategic and legislative documents as well as research papers and other documents on different topics. The shared good practices and information will foster the improvement and adaptation of ICH related policies, strengthen expert's capacity in the region and increase the efficiency and effectiveness of the safeguarding measures.

In close cooperation with the existing network of experts in South-East Europe, a steering committee with about 5-6 experts will be established and national focal points will be appointed in all SEE countries. The role of the steering committee will be to take strategic decisions related to the functioning of the Observatory, architecture of the database, methods of data collection, as well as to avoid overlapping UNESCO's resources and activities and to ensure synergy between them, etc. The national focal points will be responsible for the data collection and regular updates of the information. Periodic meetings of the steering committee or national focal points could be organized if necessary.

The Observatory will be part of the Centre's on-line

- 1) Steering committee for the Observatory established and operational;
- 2) National focal points for the Observatory appointed and information exchanged in a regular and active way;
- 3) On-line data-base with information about the ICH related policies in the SEE region created and operational;
- 4) National strategic and legislative documents, inventories and other relevant documents collected and presented in the database;
- 5) The existing network of ICH expert in SEE further strengthened;
- 6) On line platform for exchange of information created and operational;
- 7) Expert's capacity for the development of ICH related policies increased;

In the frame of this activity we plan to apply for funding with the following two project proposals:

2.1.a Project proposal

"Local policies for local heritage"

The main objective of the project is to improve the policies for safeguarding and promoting ICH at regional and local level, including the integration of ICH in sustainable development programmes, to stimulate mutual knowledge and understanding and to develop expert network in the region.

The project proposal will be submitted for funding from Black Sea Trust for Regional Cooperation.

2.1. b Project proposal

"Interactive cultural calendar for ICH in SEE"

The main objective of the project is to create a cultural calendar for the SEE region with diverse events, initiatives and activities linked to the safeguarding, promotion and popularization of ICH. The calendar will spread information about the elements of ICH with particular attention to those included in the UNESCO Lists, as well as festivals for ICH, conferences, competitions, concerts, exhibitions, crafts workshops etc. All this information will be displayed in an innovative and attractive way, including comprehensive details and interesting pictures. The calendar will be part of the Regional Centre's on-line

The project proposal will be submitted for funding from Creative Europe programme. NB: These two initiatives should be implemented only if external funding is acquired. 2. EIGHTH ANNUAL REGIONAL MEETING OF EXPERTS ON ICH IN SEE - CYPRUS (May 2014) According to the decisions taken on the Seventh annual regional meeting in Sofia to resume the good practice to focus on a concrete topic, the Eighth meeting will bring the attention on the relation of ICH with education. The meeting will be held in May 2014 in Cyprus. A half day will be dedicated to introduction of the UNESCO global capacity-building strategy and presentation of existing tools to carry out needs assessments at the national levels. Regional Centre will participate actively in the preliminary preparation of theoretical base of the meeting as well as representative/s of Sofia Centre will take part in the event.
