### Name of the Element: NOWRUZ

**Definition:** "NOWRUZ" is included in the National Inventory of ICH of the Pakistan, No. I, on 18 February 2015;

**Name of Inventory:** National Institute of Folk and Traditional Heritage (Lork Virsa), Ministry of Information, Broadcsting and National Heritage, Islamabad

Office Responsible: Lork Virsa;

**Inventory Upgrading Method:** Research (Field Research, Interviews and Meetings) together with Concerned Communities Support & Participation. The inventory will be up-graded on an annual basis starting from 2015.

**Proof of Community Participation:** The various cultural organizations, NGO's, artisans, performing artists, story-tellers, elders, men, women, children and youth of the concerned communities have participated actively and helped in the compilation process of Nowruz Nomination File. The national and regional/local media (electronic, print and social) have played a significant role in bringing Nowruz to the attention of people of Pakistan.

**Region:** Gilgit-Baltistan (former Northern Areas of Pakistan), Karachi, Quetta, Chitral, Hangu, Peshawar, Areas of Kurram Agency (FATA), Multan and Kashmir.

Brief Description: Nowruz in Pakistan is celebrated as "Alam Afrouz" or the "New Day". The communities of Balti, Shina, Brushaski, Wakhi & Khowar (Gilgit-Baltistan), Chitral, Hangu, Peshawar (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa), Areas of Kurram Agency (FATA), Hazara (Baluchistan), Shias (Kashmir), Multan (Punjab), Sindhi Shia Ismailis & Zorastrians / Parsis (Sindh) celebrate Nowruz as an "Eid" i.e. special ceremonies and prayers are offered while sweets, fruits, perfumes, flowers usually mark the offerings of Nowruz. All these communities over the years have tried to preserve and promote Nowruz celebrations. The main attractions of Nowruz in Pakistan include socio-cultural and religious gatherings, Daa-daa (where the new-borns are made to sit in fruit baskets), jumping over the fire to wash away sins, folk games like egg striking (in this game eggs are dipped in vinegar over night)/ exchange of hard boiled colored eggs, Yak Polo, Korovans (folk songs & dances), traditional dances (Balti, Hunza, Chitrali to name a few), traditional fruits/sweets ; etc. However, Nowruz has remained in anonymity for many years. It's not that Nowruz was not celebrated in Pakistan; it was celebrated but overlooked. Over the past few years Nowruz has received recognition at different levels including the government. The Pakistani people are now more receptive and interested in celebrtaing the various cultural activities i.e. Christmas, Holi, Basant and Nowruz even at school/college/universities level.
