

- 1. The foundation is contributing within the ICH Steering Committee of the UNESCO NATCOM to safeguarding the ICH of Curaçao. Part of the tasks of the Steering Committee is the setup, and the guiding of the process of the inventorying of the ICH of Curaçao;
- 2. The foundation is leading and guiding two elementary schools in adopting two monuments with connections to both the tangible and intangible traditions around water management. This is part of the ASP school projects of the UNESCO.
- 3. In an interactive way the Museum is narrating the ICH of daily life around a *kunuku* house, in particular the period between 1850-1950. See Facebook: museumkasdipalimaishi.
- 4. Research and documentation on oral history: a. History of the resistance movement during the period of enslavement and slavery heritage in collaboration with the network of Plataforma Berdat Historiko (=the Platform of Historical Truth) and the Plataforma Sklabitut i Herensha di Sklabitut (=The Slavery and Slave Heritage Platform). b. Documentation through oral history and historical research on the emancipation of women in different dimensions of daily life. (see: Kòrsou su Muhénan Pionero; Jeanne D. Henriquez, Archivo Nashonal, 2002). c. Documentation on the history and culture of Curaçao through the production of power point presentations for different target groups; including elementary schools. This project is called the Agents of Light. The agent of light is a voluntary person who helps to disseminate the history and intangible culture of Curaçao in schools, neighborhoods and (youth) organizations. d. The research and production of a workshop on the slavery songs for different target groups.
- 5. The foundation is in the process of experimenting on a school of traditional craftsmanship through different workshops that are done monthly, including ones on the making of coconut oil, making medicine from aloe vera and aloe vera cream, storytelling, making of cactus fences and cactus soup. In these workshops the intangible heritage of each topic is also transmitted.

The board of the foundation consists of members with an extensive knowledge about the history of Curaçao, by virtue of being bearers of tradition received from their ancestors, but also because they are part of different networks. Three members are bearers of an extensive legacy from the period of enslavement and the aftermath, because of two ancestors who have been the managers on the plantation where the biggest slave revolt took place in 1795: the Tula Revolt. They have a close relationship with the neighborhood where the plantation is situated. One of the members of the board is the president of the network Plataforma Berdat Historiko (=The Platform of the Historical Truth). This platform organizes every year the Tula Route. The Tula Route is immensely popular. The curator forms part of the board. She is both an historian and a gender specialist. The board consists of 7 persons. The Museum works with a staff of 6 persons, consisting of paid personnel and volunteers, including the curator and the coordinator. Both are experienced in the field of history. The curator has an extensive knowledge in the field of oral history and represents the Foundation within the ICH Steering Committee of UNESCO Curaçao. The guides in the museum transfer the intangible heritage in an interactive way and continue to be exposed constantly to new insights for the transmission of the ICH within their work.

- a. Honoring the Museum week with aspects of the intangible heritage. This year special attention will be given to the *kachu*; the cow horn for transferring of messages on death, birth, to be used during harvest time and funerals. The performance is in the hands of the *kachu* community.
- b. Honoring the ICH within the *kunuku* cottages and the daily life around these cottages, with the bread oven, the charcoal oven, the chalk oven, the knowledge around the medicinal plants, including the aloe vera and the many uses of the cactus. This exposition is made possible with the help of different practitioners in the ICH field.
- c. Revitalizing the slave songs/work songs with the help of experts in the field of ICH.





WILLEMSTAD - Het Museum Kas di Pal'i Maishi op Bándabou houdt een fundraisinglunch om het nodige geld in te zamelen voor de uitbreiding van de expositie en restauratie van het museum. WILLEMSTAD - Het dak van Museo Kas di Pal'i Maishi, bij Ascencion is hersteld. Dat maakt de organisatie bekend.

"De maisstengels die in 2014 bij de restauratie van het dak zijn aangebracht moesten nodig vernieuwd worden. Door de droogte bleek het onmogelijk om genoeg maisstengels van het juiste soort (pichipue) te verkrijgen voor een plantaardig dak. Een goede dakbedekking bestaat namelijk uit 4 tot 6 lagen maisstengels", aldus de organisatie.

Monumentenzorg heeft er daarom voor gekozen om een palapadak te laten plaatsen. "Wat we palapa noemen is eigenlijk een open huisje met een dak bedekt door palmstengels en droge palmbladeren (dadelpalmen, cocospalm, of het gebruik van bamboestengels). Het gebruik van planten om het dak te bedekken is een systeem dat

bekendstaat bij vele culturen in de wereld, zoals in Aziatische en Afrikaanse landen, maar ook in Zuid-Amerika en in Europa. Het werd vroeger geïdentificeerd met woningen van arme mensen. Nu wordt het steeds meer een luxe dakbedekking", aldus het museum.

Om het dak van Kas di Pal'i Maishi in de toekomst toch in originele staat terug te kunnen brengen, gaat het museum zelf het langstelige gras, vetiver, kweken dat goed kan groeien in het lokale klimaat. Daarnaast is de organisatie op zoek gegaan naar de originele zaden van de pichipue, om ook die te telen.

"De grassoort vetiver bevat een olie die zowel voor medicinale doeleinden gebruikt wordt als voor parfums. In de kunuku van het museum kan men dit gras in de nabije toekomst bezichtigen en veel later, als alles goed gaat, ook op het dak."
