

ANME is an international coalition of organizations, manufacturers, foundations, professionals of health prevention and individuals in Europe who are active in the areas of naturopathy, traditional medicine, complementary and alternative medicine as well as in salutogenesis - health promotion for human beings and animals (grouped under the acronym "CAM"). The reason of founding ANME e.V. in 2001 has been the common sense to realize and promote Natural Medicine, Traditional Medicine and Naturopathy (=TM/CAM) as a cultural treasure and heritage of all mankind. Within the framework of the UNESCO Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage, ANME e.V. endeavours to identify and document traditional medicines which, through the legal situation, are in danger of being unable to retain or obtain the status of a medicinal product.

Most European members of ANME e.V. are daily working health practitioners and patients keeping the old traditions of healing methods. Considering in particular concerns of quality assurance, efforts need to be made to prevent traditional medicines from disappearing. As an NGO and Non-Profit Organisation,

- it identifies and describes the reality of TM/CAM in daily working conditions and in political relations to legislation.
- it supports the initiative of specific therapies (e.g. the KNEIPP-therapy) and their representatives on regional, national and European level.
- it is the initiator of research projects, e.g. "Traditional Medicine and migrants" (please see: attached a confidential script in German)

- bringing together European and national specialized groups, professional organisations and associations as well as patient groups and biopharmaceutical manufactures, education institutes and committed individuals.
- non-profit and voluntary work which serves the well-being of all European citizens.
- supporting the work of specialized groups, patient groups, national and European institutes as well as groups whose work contributes to reinforce and promote the importance of complementary and alternative medicine.
- demanding to respect CAM as an intangible cultural heritage of all mankind as per the UNESCO Convention.
- representation of the interests of traditional natural healing and of natural medicine (TM/CAM) in the fields of health, nutrition, consumer protection and research at European, national and sub-regional level.

ANME supports the safeguarding and the recognition of TM/CAM by a number of activities and projects:

- it initiates and conducts research activities such as the collection of data on TM/CAM (e.g. EU-funded CAMBRELLA Research project 2009-2012, Member of the Advisory Board, www.cambrella.eu)
- as an interest group it takes stand on relevant political and legal decisions projects (e.g. EU-policies on patient's rights, Member of the European Public Health Alliance-EPHA www.epha.org)
- the ANME-Award promotes persons who have done excellent activities in the field of TM/CAM (www.anme-ngo.eu/de/anme/foerderpreis.html)
- the association regularly brings together all relevant actors in a diversity of symposia and meetings and awareness-raising projects (since 2004 ANME has organized four European TM/CAM Symposia: www.anme-ngo.eu/symposia)

- the 4th Symposium was held in Vienna together with the Austrian National Agency for Intangible Cultural Heritage in 2010 (please see attached file:4th EU-symposium in Vienna),
- the 5th ANME EU-Symposium in September 2013 in Brussels ("Legal practice of CAM") brought together CAM-providers of all health professions in Europe. As a result of the meeting an European Committee for CAM profession was founded, which is to draft a common occupational profile for all CAM professions.

Our members have a profound knowledge and education in terms of knowledge and practices concerning nature and the universe. There are scientists too, working in the field of anthropology, pedagogic, pharmacy, medicine and research.

Since 2003, ANME is a member of EPHA-European Public Health Alliance. Several members of our extended board are attending meetings like the Annual Conference, PCM-Political Coordination Meeting or several Working Groups (esp. CAM-WG, Health Professionals-WG, Pharmaceutical-WG)

Since 2005, ANME is a member of ECHAMP-European Coalition for Homeopathic and Anthroposophical Medicinal Products.

Since 2009, ANME is a member in the CAM-Interestgroup of MEPs, EU-Parliament

In February 2009, ANME initiated a motion to implement a separate article regarding ICH in the new EU-Directive about "patient's rights": "Today and in future each patient in Europe and each member state has the right to claim traditional/CAM methods in its original context as an Intangible Cultural Heritage." ANME has contacted the EU-Commission, DG-Sanco and DG Education, national UNESCO authorities in Austria and Germany and national ministries for Health. In Austria, we are in close relationship with the Austrian Commission for UNESCO in charge of the national implementation of the ICH Convention. We have had a common European Symposium 2010 in the Austrian Ministry for Health. In Germany, we are also in contact with the National Commission for UNESCO and participated in some of their workshops on ICH together with other ICH practitioners. We support Kneipp-Worldwide and the Deutscher Naturheilbund.



Statutes

Association for Natural Medicine in Europe e. V.

Modification: October 10th, 2012

§ 1

Objective



- The Association for Natural Medicine in Europe e. V. is a coalition of organizations, manufacturers, foundations, professionals of health prevention and individuals in Europe who are active in the areas of naturopathy, traditional medicine, non-conventional medicine, complementary and alternative medicine as well as in health literacy and salutogenesis for human beings and animals. The mentioned units have been groped under the acronym "CAM".
- 2. It is used for coordination and common safeguarding of interests of CAM in the European and national policy.

§ 2

Name, Seat, Legal Status

- 1. The association uses the name Association for Natural Medicine in Europe ANME
- 2. ANME has its seat in Schöneck, Germany.
- 3. The working languages of the ANME are German and English.
- 4. The one and only purpose of the association is the pursuit of non-profitaims as defined in § 51 Abgabenordnung (German Tax Code). This is especially achieved by:
 - a. the promotion and protection of the CAM for the common good
 - b. promoting autonomous holistic health care of the population in the countries of origin of the members
 - c. the collection, the increment and deepening of knowledge and experience in CAM
- ANME acts selflessly and only pursues idealistic and non-profit goals. As a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) and Non-Profit Organization she pursues exclusively non-material goals.
- 6. ANME may use its means solely for purposes in accordance with the terms of the statutes.
- 7. Members of *ANME* have no share of any profits or other allocations in connection with their membership from *ANME*'s funds.
- 8. No person or legal entity may benefit from expenses alien to the purposes of *ANME* or from disproportionate remuneration.

§ 3

Tasks

- 1. Within its objectives, ANME pursues the following central tasks:
 - a. promote, preserve and gain recognition of CAM in Europe,
 - b. encourage the cooperation of the member organisations and interested parties,
 - c. promotion of education and further training at European level
 - d. promotion of CAM research in Europe

- e. promotion of salutogenesis in Europe
- f. The granting of the ANME-award will be made to persons who have made an exceptional manner earned the CAM. The price has been doted with 500,- Euro and is awarded on special occasions.
- 2. As long as its non-profit orientation as stated in § 2 is not endangered, ANME may, within its objectives, assume further tasks.

§ 4

Membership

- 1. Membership in *ANME* is open solely to organisations, foundations, manufacturers and individuals of the area of CAM that
 - a. are domiciled in a member state of the Council of Europe
 - b. by the laws of their home country can be subject of rights and duties.
- 2. Persons and organizations that promote CAM may obtain membership by resolution of the Executive Board.
- 3. There is no right to membership.
- 4. With his accession the member agrees that in connection with membership required personal data, taking into account the provisions of the Federal Data Protection ACT applicable to the association, will be processed and used. These are the following disclosures: name, first name, contact details and bank account. Without this consent, a member can not be justified. The personal data transmitted shall be used exclusively for club purposes. This specifically includes the management of members, conducting general meetings and events of the association and the proliferation of electronic mail. Any further processing or use (e.g. transfer to third parties) without the consent of the member is not allowed.

§ 5

Admission, Withdrawal, Expulsion

- 1. Applications for admission shall be addressed in writing to the Executive Board of *ANME* which decides about the admission.
- 2. A member may withdraw from *ANME* only at the end of the calendar year. Written notification shall be given to the committee of *ANME* at least three months previously. The withdrawal notice does not relieve the member of current obligations to *ANME*. Any claims of the withdrawing member against *ANME* originating in the membership shall be excluded.
- 3. For serious reasons, the board may approve the request for an immediate termination.
- 4. A member may be expelled for not meeting his obligations to *ANME* or for jeopardizing the goals of *ANME* or its non-profit constitution.
- 5. Before being expelled, the member shall be warned and be granted the opportunity to meet his obligations within a reasonable period of time.
- 6. The right of expulsion for good cause remains unaffected.

§ 6

Membership Fees

1. The Extended Board decides by resolution, requiring a two-thirds majority, a regulation that stipulates the nature, amount and due date of membership fees. Upon motion of a Board member, the general assembly of members decides by a simple majority.

- 2. The membership fees shall not exceed the funds needed for performing the proposed statutory functions of *ANME*.
- 3. All members contribute fees according to the regulation.
- 4. The application for a free associate membership may only be submitted by organizations and associations.

§ 7

Organs

- 1. The organs of ANME are:
 - a. the Executive Board
 - b. the Extended Board
 - c. the General Assembly of members
- 2. The Extended Board may decide to set up further associate organs or bodies, particularly special committees. These bodies are generally dependent.

§ 8

Executive and Extended Board

- 1. The Executive Board of *ANME* consists of a minimum of four and maximum of six members:
 - a. the president
 - b. at least one vice-president
 - c. the treasurer
 - d. the secretary
- 2. The Extended Board of *ANME* consists of a minimum of five and maximum of eleven members:
 - a. the Executive Board
 - b. and at least one adviser
- 3. The President and his/her vice-presidents are the legal representatives of *ANME* in litigation and for all other purposes according to § 26 of the German Civil Code (BGB).
- 4. The Executive Board manages the affairs of the association and performs all administrative tasks not assigned to other bodies of *ANME*. The Executive Boards duties include in particular the following:
 - a. to carry out the resolutions of the general assembly of members,
 - b. to convoke and prepare the general assembly of members, directed over by the president or his vice-president,
 - c. to keep the accounts and prepare the annual activity and financial report for each fiscal year,
 - d. to admit members and assist with their admission according to these statutes,
 - e. to conclude and terminate contracts and other legal relationships for *ANME*.
- 5. The Extended Board is elected for a period of three years.
- 6. The Extended Board may adopt its resolutions by written circulation.
- 7. If a director office is vacant, the Board may provisionally appoint another member to the Extended Board. The Board may also through personal union one of its members entrust the exercise of two offices.

- 1. The general assembly of members is competent for all tasks that are not assigned to the Extended Board or other bodies of *ANME*. It holds the exclusive competence for the following affairs:
 - a. receive the annual report with the activity and financial report and to give formal approval to the actions of the Executive Board,
 - b. regulate membership dues,
 - c. elect and remove members of the Extended Board,
 - d. alter the statutes,
 - e. closure of ANME.
- 2. The ordinary general assembly of members is held at least once a year. An extraordinary general assembly of members is to be convoked when
 - a. the committee decides the convocation for urgent reasons,
 - b. 1/10 of the members demand the convocation of the Board, stating the reasons in writing.
- 3. The general assembly of members is summoned by the president or his vice-president by written invitation, stating the agenda, giving at least four weeks' notice. The annual activity report and the financial report of the Board have to be attached to this notice. The term commences the day after the invitations are sent out.
- 4. The invitation is deemed to be received by the member if the Board sent it to his last known address or e-mail-address.
- 5. Up to two weeks prior to the general assembly of members, any member may request in writing to supplement the agenda. Any motion proposed after that date or during the general assembly must be approved by a two-thirds-majority of the assembly.
- 6. The general assembly of members is conducted by the president, in his absence by one of the vice-president and in their absence by the treasurer. If no member of the Board is present, the assembly appoints a chairman for the meeting.
- 7. For the election of the Extended Board, the general assembly of members appoints an official in charge, an election worker and a recording secretary who are not members of the Extended Board. Before starting the procedure the actual number of votes must be detected.
- 8. Each present individual member has one vote.
- 9. Members that are organizations with up to 50 individual members, producers and foundations have one vote. To reflect the strength of organizations, organizations receive per started another 50 members one more vote to a maximum of 20 votes.
- 10. Associated members have no voting rights.
- 11.Members of the Extended Board will be elected one by one in the order stated in § 8 by acclamation. The right to apply for a secret ballot shall remain unaffected. The candidate who receives more than half of the valid votes cast shall be considered elected. If none of the candidates receives the required number of votes, there will be a runoff election between the two candidates who received the most votes. In the case of a tie, the returning officer of the assembly decides by drawing a lot.
- 12.After the election of the members of Extended Board the cash auditor will be elected corresponding to clause 11.
- 13.As a general rule, resolutions are adopted by simple majority if these statutes or regulations that are based on them do not expressly provide otherwise.
- 14. The following matters can only be put to vote with a two-thirds-majority:
 - a. Changes of these statutes, name and objective of the association (also in accordance with § 3 clause 2).
 - b. Changes of the legal structure.
- 15. To dissolve ANME, a four-fifth-majority of the submitted votes is needed (see below §11, clause1)

Office

- 1. ANME runs an office in order to fulfill its functions and to handle current business.
- Letters, motions to the assembly of members and to the committee and all kinds of correspondence concerning ANME, are to be sent to the office. The office is to examine all correspondence and documents as well as, if required, document and file them.
- 3. Every member has the right to inspect the business documents of *ANME* at the seat of office, to make copies or have them made at cost. This right expires upon termination of membership.
- 4. For tasks of the office and the association may be completed full-time employment.
- 5. Travel expenses and reimbursement of expenses may be granted to the Extended Board and members under tax packages (tax code, volunteering). In addition a flat-rate daily allowance is granted. The amount is determined by the Extended Board.

§ 11

Dissolution

- The general assembly of members decides about the dissolution of ANME. The
 motion for the dissolution must be put on the agenda by at least 1/4 of the
 members no less than three months prior to a specially convoked assembly of
 members.
- 2. In case of dissolution of ANME, it shall be liquidated according to §§ 47 ff. of the German Civil Code (BGB), if necessary. The committee is in charge of the liquidation. Any remaining assets are to be converted into EURO and to be donated to another acknowledged non-profit organisation in Germany.

§ 12

Board of Arbitration


A board of arbitration is elected every three years by the assembly of members. It consists of three persons who are not members of the committee. The board of arbitration may be applied to by every single member or by the Board.

§ 13

Final Provision

- 1. The place of jurisdiction shall be Frankfurt-on-Main, Germany. This jurisdiction shall also apply to disputes about matters for which the laws of other states of the European Union or private international law provide other jurisdictions.
- 2. The first statute of *ANME* has been drawn up in German, English and French. It has taken effect upon signature by the founding members.
- 3. Any clause of the forgoing statutes which is found invalid has no effect on the validity of any other clause of the statutes.

1. Preliminary remark

Folk medicine has a long tradition. In popular usage it is associated with naturopathy and so-called *homespun remedies*. Not long ago people mildly smiled at it. But just a lot of homespun remedies meanwhile are recognized and developed as basis of complementary and alternative medicine (CAM-Complementary and Alternative Medicine) at a progressive rate.

The investigation of CAM, the recognition of its roots in the folk medicine and the preservation of traditional knowledge and methods of healing are central requests of ANME. Folk medicine as an original part of CAM is entitled not only to be preserved, but also to be recognized as *intangible cultural heritage* according to the UNESCO-convention.

Under the mentioned aspects the following project has been developed under the sponsorship of ANME - Association for Natural Medicine in Europe e.V. with administrative seat in 61137 Schöneck (near Frankfurt/M). Reprensentative of the project for North-Rhine Westphalia is Dipl. Päd. Zita Wienecke-Höfer.

ANME (founded in 2001) is an NGO. The protection of interests of traditional naturopathy and natural medicine (CAM) is among its duties in the scopes health, food, consumer protection, service and research on European and national level.

A constantly enlarged network built up by ANME also serves this purpose. It includes European and national experts societies, professional guilds and associations, patients organisations, biological-pharmaceutical manufacturers, education institutes and engaged individuals for the support and the research of CAM

.

In advisory function ANME has taken part in a first triennial European research project to CAM. CAMBRELLA, so the name of this research project, has been occupied with a comprehensive stocktaking of CAM. It has ended in december 2012 with the production of a *Roadmap for European CAM Research*. Here further priorities of CAM research and demands on representatives of European and national policy have been formulated belonging to the scope of health and customer protection. The participation of different organisations in this project has been a contribution to an interdisciplinary interchange of knowledge which is not to underrate.

2. Project description

2.1. Project reasons

Traditionally proved medicines, remedies and manners of therapies are a treasure of knowledge and experience gained in many centuries. They are a valuable cultural heritage, which has to be preserved for all human beings.

Traditionally approved remedies also include, like mentioned above, the so called homespun remedies. They are part of the traditional folk medicine. Homespun remedies is a term in the German speaking area. Numerous of these remedies, in particular of the herbal sector or of hydrotherapy are just well known.

In contrast *homespun remedies* of natural folk medicinal traditions of foreign fellow citizens are widely unknown. This should not remain so.

With its aspiration to preserve traditional knowledge and healing manners ANME directs its interest also to these naturopathic folk medicinal traditions, which migrants bring and already have brought from their own countries into our society.

2.2. Project aim

Project aim is the collection and categorisation of traditional folk medicinal remedies (homespun remedies)) and their classification into the cultural connections of the particular country where the migrants come from. Aspects of the different definition of the term culture and aspects of ethnomedicine will be considered during the collection as well as the long term objective to make this collection and categorisation accessible to research.

2.3. Formal approach

With its project ANME enters new territory. For this reason and based on the working intensity, such a project can be tackled and realised at first only in small steps and within regional borders. Our plan has a distinctive interactive approach. We enter into a dialogue with members of different cultures and different backgrounds of experience. This will have the character of a living process and so this dialogue will have consequences on the contents of the project.

Our parameters form a flexible working frame which is defined by an aim whose contents however are substantially formed by the answers and ideas of the participants in this project. Therefore the questionnaire included in the attachment will have an essential position.

2.3.1. Regional limitation and selection of the region

It is depending on the location of the representative of the project of ANME: In this case North Rhine-Westphalia.

This province with its mining tradition in large parts is traditionally impressed by the influx of labourers from German regions and from abroad. There are good connections at local government level. Therefore the investigation is limited at the Rhein-Erft-Kreis, here first at the city of Kerpen.

Members of 116 nations are living in Kerpen. About a quarter of the population has a migration biography. In 2011 the city council has adopted an integration concept.

This forum is called *Kerpen gelingt gemeinsam (Kerpen succeeds together)*. Under this title the city council presents at its homepage themes belonging to foreigners policy and integration. (source: Kerpen, Familien- und Einkaufsführer 2013)

2.3.2. Approach to members of a cultural region

The search occurs by contacts to the suitable organisations and committees at municipal level. Here in particular by contact to the integration representative of the city of Kerpen. After a short image of the project, she promised her support and she also will take part in establishing contacts with migrants organisations and with other organisations, institutions and committees occupied with the interests of migrants. Another short image of the project within the scope of a discussion to the double citizenship which has taken place in the rooms of the local mosque community, has found there unequivocal acceptance. The project has been considered as an esteem of the folk medicinal traditions of another cultural regions and as another form of contribution to integration.

2.4. Approach with regards to contents

In the areas of naturopathic traditions, differences have to be supposed concerning the rural, urban and regional origin of the interviewees.

Therefore it seems to make sense to use these criteria as main criteria for registration of *homespun remedies* and to associate homespun remedies in front of this background for example to the particular diseases where they are used.

Besides this, attention has to be bestowed on traditional supporters, on folk medicinal methods of healing, on the particular culturally impressed concept of disease and on the spiritual backgrounds of origins and roots of diseases which are adjudicated by the prevailing ethnos. Another attention is turned to possible aspects of prevention in the folk medicinal traditions.

Therefore it is important to discuss the question to what extent traditional *homespun remedies* are still used or wether they exist only as a memory of traditions. If living traditions are still existing at the present settlement, the question of the intercultural combination of different manners of healing has to be discussed (own traditional manners of healing are combined and/or are completed with medicinal therapies of the new surrounding).

All data will be collected by interviews of migrants who are interested in this project (oral history).

2.5. Duration of the project

Currently not exactly to be determined. At least twelve months can be assumed.

3. Finance plan

At the moment a finance plan is compiled.

4. Publication of the results

It occurs after the end of the project. Intermediate results will be published only on legitimated demand.

5. Concluding remark

The enclosed questionnaire is the basis of this special project which serves the collection and preservation of cultural traditions belonging to the sector of folk medicine. Coincidental the project provides a contribution to integration. At its beginning the project, its objects and the questionnaire will be explained at length to all interested fellow citizens with migration background and the project will be presented as a process which flow into a living dialogue to which the questionnaire offers the basis. 
